



covering operations of the 6 New England states. Mr. Erskine is a graduate of the school of management from the University of Massachusetts Amherst achieving a bachelor's of science degree. He spent over a decade working in the Boston building trades in the Laborer's International Union of North America, and has strong ties to the unions throughout New England. His strong union background has helped him open many doors during his

career with OSHA.

Joe Green has worked for the U.S. Department of Labor OSHA since 2000.



Prior to becoming a Compliance Assistance Specialist in 2018, Joe was a Safety and Health Compliance Officer for 18 years. During that time, Joe has investigated well over 500 workplace accidents, 50 work place fatalities and has inspected over 2000 jobsites and establishments. As a Compliance Assistance Specialist, Joe now works to assist employers on complying and staying up to date with OSHA regulations. Prior to working for OSHA, Joe worked in the private sector for over a decade for a large mechani-

cal contractor as a supervisor.

Rob Braczyk is an Industrial Hygienist (IH) with the US Department of Labor



– OSHA, Andover Area Office. As an IH, he conducts on-site inspections of private sector workplaces to ensure compliance with health and safety standards.
